Summary of the Course

This course provides you with an understanding of the purpose of the quality literature review in education. The course will be conducted so you to analyse, synthesise and evaluate literature to provide a theoretical framework for a small research project in education.

Note: This course is available only to EdPrDoc students.

Course Learning Outcomes

1. Analyse and evaluate theory and research in the academic literature in education.
2. Identify gaps in theory and research in the academic literature related to education.
3. Synthesise related theory and research in the academic literature to develop a conceptual framework to guide a small research project in education.
4. Articulate key findings from a comprehensive review of theory and research related to a research topic in education.

Teaching Strategies

Rationale This course provides students with the opportunity to undertake a literature review on a research topic of interest in education. The teaching approach will involve students as they discuss current theory and practice, and learn new information. Students will be required to take responsibility for their own learning in this course.

Teaching strategies This course will be largely self-directed learning for the student, with support towards the building of an extensive literature review. This will be undertaken under the guidance of an academic supervisor.

Length: 5000 words


This task requires you to complete a literature review paper. The final

- 2.Introduction sets context, background, significance, what will be covered
- 3.Main body critical discussion of key research and findings. Identify gaps in the literature
- 4.Conclusions, directions for research, implications for practice, recommendations
- 5.References APA style
