## Program and Course Terminology

Terminology	Definition
<b>Integrated First Year Courses</b>	Students must complete a 36UOC (6 course) of Introductory Business core course.
<b>myBCom</b>	Students must complete three non-credit bearing myBCom professional development elements including myBCom Blueprint (COMM0999), myBCom First Year Portfolio (COMM1999) and myBCom Graduation Portfolio (COMM3999).
<b>Work Integrated Learning Course (WIL)</b>	Students must complete 6 UOC Work Integrated Learning (WIL) course within their program. This course can count as a free elective or where applicable, can count as a Commerce major elective or Synthesis course.
<b>Final Year Synthesis</b>	Students must complete either a 6 UOC Synthesis of Learning Course, or a 0 UOC Synthesis Experience. This course can count as a free elective or where applicable, can count as a Commerce major elective or WIL course. FYS would only be recognised if the course was completed within the remaining 48 UOC in the BCom component.
<b>Economics Core Courses</b>	Students must complete 48UOC (8 courses) of level 1 and 2 Economics Core Courses.
<b>Economics Electives</b>	Students must complete 30UOC (5 courses) of Economics electives or accepted substitutes of Economics electives to ensure a student completes a <b>minimum of 78 UOC (13 courses) of Economics courses across the program.</b>
<b>Optional Economics Majors</b>	Students may wish to complete an optional Economics major(s) (ECONV1, ECONT1, ECONU1). If students do not complete an optional Economics major(s), students will complete program with a default major by completing program requirements. Note: Students cannot complete both a default major and an optional Economics major. If you choose to study 2 optional Economics majors, you must choose another 36UOC (6 courses) from the second major that do not overlap with the first major.
<b>Commerce Major</b>	Students must complete at least 1 Commerce major in an approved discipline stream offered by the UNSW Business School. Note that the 48 UOC includes the first disciplinary course in the core courses.
<b>Free Electives</b>	Free Electives account for 36UOC (6 courses) to satisfy the degree requirement of 192UOC (32 courses)

<b>Maximum Majors/Minors</b>	Students may complete up to 3 majors or 2 majors and 1 minor within their program. Within a minimum of at least 1 major from Commerce and 1 major from Economics. Students completing 3 majors may exceed 192 UOC.  <u>Note:</u> Students cannot complete both a default major and an optional Economics major. However, can complete 2 optional Economics majors.
<b>Level 1 limit</b>	The maximum level one limit in this degree is 72UOC (12 courses).
<b>Overall Program UOC</b>	Students must complete a minimum 192 UOC (32 courses) across program requirements.
