## Progression Plan for 2018 commencing students

Terminology	Definition
<b>Program compulsory core courses &amp; Introductory Business Course</b>	Students must complete ECON1401 as the compulsory core course and choose another 6UOC of Introductory Business core course.
<b>Economics Major</b>	Students must complete at least one major in Economics, Econometrics or Financial Economics consisting of 60UOC. The 60UOC includes 36UOC from the compulsory first and second year core courses. (The Introductory Business Core course and ECON1401 do not count towards a major.) Students must complete at least three (3) level 3 courses (numbered 3XXX).
<b>Economics Elective</b>	Account for 12UOC (2 courses) from the School of Economics to ensure a student completes a minimum of 84UOC of Economics courses within the School of Economics. ACCT1501 is included in the 84UOC.
<b>Business School Electives</b>	<p>Account for 12UOC (2 courses). Students are free to use these UOC to complete course from the Business School, however they need to be mindful of the program limit on Level 1 courses (60UOC) when making their selection.</p> <p>GEN courses cannot count as Free electives.</p> <p>Maximum level one limit in this degree is 60UOC.</p>
