Program compulsory core & flexible core courses	<p>30UOC of compulsory and flexible core courses which students must complete under this degree.</p> <p>Maximum level one limit is 72UOC for this degree.</p>
Business Co -op Honours Major	<p>Students complete a co- UOC in specified disciplinary courses outside the first year core.) , for the majority of majors, student</p> <p>The 48 UOC of courses at level 4 relates to the Honours, or research training component of this degree. Some include additional research training in lower level courses (e.g. level 2 or 3). The level 4 courses will include 24 disciplinary and research training courses and a 24 UOC thesis.</p> <p>On satisfactory completion of the requirements of this program, students will be awarded a class of honours. This is dependent on the weighted average mark (WAM) of the level 4 courses.</p> <p>Class 1: WAM of 85 and over</p> <p>Class 2(1): WAM of 75 to less than 85</p> <p>Class 2(2): WAM of 65 to less than 75</p>

	<p>Class 3: WAM of 50 to less than 65</p> <p>For specific details of all courses, and examination of the thesis, please refer to the relevant discipline plan. (Refer Table A)</p>
Industrial Training Experience	<p>Industry Placement courses account for 36 UOC. These courses are in addition to the requirements of the Co-op Honours Major. Students complete 3 industry placement courses within the area of their co-op scholarship, with each course worth 12 UOC.</p> <p>The first industry placement course in Finance is: FINS2101 Industry Placement 1 (12 UOC)</p>
UNSW Business School Elective	<p>6UOC in UNSW Business School courses to ensure a student completes a minimum of 132UOC of Business courses within the Bachelor of Commerce.</p>
General Education	<p>Account for 12UOC (2 courses) and are to be taken outside the UNSW Business School. Please note that students enrolled in programs within the UNSW Business School cannot take General Education courses offered by the UNSW Business School (i.e. GENC code). These restrictions also apply to the following courses: GENL2015 The World of Work; GENL2021 An Introduction to the Australian Legal System; GENL2032 Cyberspace Law 2.0; GENL5021 Business Law Basics.</p>
