Progression Plan for 2021 Commencing Students

Terminology	Definition
Integrated 1st Year Courses	42UOC of integrated 1 st year courses which students must complete under this degree. Maximum level one limit for the Commerce component is 60UOC.
Commerce Major	Major Requirements: 48 UOC in an approved disciplinary stream containing at least 18 UOC at level 3. Note that the 48 UOC includes one course from the Integrated First Year. This means that students will complete 42 UOC in specified disciplinary courses outside the core. For any majors that require ECON1202, MATH1011/MATH1031/MATH1131/MATH1141/MATH1151 completed under the Science component will act as a substitute so in these cases a student should not do ECON1202 but instead complete another <u>Major elective</u> to meet the 48UOC requirement.
UNSW Business School Elective	UNSW Business School courses ensure a student completes a minimum of 96UOC of Business courses within the Bachelor of Commerce. The exact number of courses to complete will depend on the major chosen. GEN courses cannot be counted as Business School electives.
MyBcom	Students need to complete three non-credit bearing myBCom professional development elements including COMM0999 myBCom Blueprint, COMM1999 myBCom First Year Portfolio and COMM3999 myBCom Graduation Portfolio.
Final Year Synthesis	Students must complete either a 6 UOC Synthesis of Learning Course, or a 0 UOC Synthesis Experience. Students who complete a Synthesis course that is also a Work Integrated Learning course within a major, will meet a major elective, WIL and Synthesis requirement.
