1. Infection, Immunity & Inflammation Theme

The Infection, Immunity, and Inflammation (Triple I) UNSW Research Theme is actively engaged in understanding and addressing diseases affected by infection, immunity, and inflammation. Our key objectives are:

- x Build and maintain world-class collaborative research networks to improve diseases driven by infection, immunity and inflammation
- x Build capacity to develop evidence-based interventions
- x Translate research into clinical practice and policy
- x Assess implementation of policy or guidelines
- x Develop new models of care
- x Share knowledge to enhance clinical care and community understanding
- x Build our knowledge on diseases

Applicants who are successful in Stage One will be required to present their proposals to the Presentation Review Panel. Further details will be communicated to shortlisted applicants in due course.

Successful stage one applicants may be provided feedback on specific areas of their proposal, drawing on the insights of the Grant Review Panel. This feedback is intended to support applicants in refining their proposals in preparation for Stage Two of the application process.

Grants will be awarded based on these presentations.
