You are invited to donate a pathology specimen from your body to the Museum of Human Disease at UNSW Sydney for the purpose of pathology education and medical research. Your donation will make possible the training of health care professionals as well as the health education of school students and the wider community. The University accepts pathology specimens in accordance with the provisions of the *Human Tissue Act 1983*. Please take time to read the following points relating to the donor program before completing the Consent Form.

You should discuss with your healthcare provider whether they think donating part of your body will be feasible and advisable. We

These circumstances may include, but are not limited to:

- Extensive damage to the specimen
- Certain communicable diseases (for example, prion diseases) where the risk of transmission to staff is deemed too high
- If too much time has elapsed between removal of the specimen and notification of the university
- Planned University shutdowns (e.g. Christmas/New Year break)

Please note that due to these factors and possibly others, a signed Consent Form intending donation . Therefore, the UNSW Museum of Human Disease cannot be held liable for any costs incurred through the rejection of a donation for any reason.
