(1B) Submit an Apply Online application (between 1 August and 15 November)

A program application must exist on Apply Online before an offer can be made. Applies to non-embedded applicants (Category A) only.

<u>Action</u>: Go to the <u>Apply Online website</u> to complete and submit an admission application for program 4518 BPsychSc(Hons) no later than 15 November.

Select 'undergraduate' as the application type and have the PDF of your "Intention" form ready to upload (see 1A, above).

(2A) Receive application outcome from the School (mid-December / January)

Email is how application outcomes – successful and unsuccessful – will be communicated by the School. Applies to ALL applicants (Category A and B).

Places for the Honours year will be finalised <u>after Term 3 results are released</u> (see <u>Results Key Dates</u>).

Successful applicants will receive an email stating 1) that their application was successful, 2) their supervisor allocation, and 3) details of the mandatory Orientation Meeting in January (see 4, below). This is the only 'outcome' that embedded students will receive. Non-embedded students will also receive a Letter of Offer from Admissions (see 2B, below).

Unsuccessful applicants will receive an email stating that their application was not successful. Embedded students will be transferred by their Program Authority to the relevant pass degree³ in order to graduate at the next available opportunity. Non-embedded students will either graduate as planned (single degree) or continue with the non-Science component of their ed students will



<u>Action 2 (Category A only)</u>: <u>Go online</u> to formally accept or decline their Letter of Offer from UNSW Admissions.

(4) Attend mandatory Orientation Meeting (late January)

Every student that accepts an offer must attend this meeting.

All new Honours year students must attend a mandatory Orientation Meeting in late January. Only after attending this meeting will students be permitted to enrol.

<u>Actions</u>: Review the <u>"Detailed Honours Information" document</u> and <u>Honours FAQs</u>, and think about any questions you may want to ask the Honours Co-ordination team at the meeting.
